I. Strengths

III. Recommendations

1. Identify more specific criteria to evaluate the program's effectiveness in meeting its stated purpose "to prepare students to be professionally trained social scientists and practitioners in [several] areas..." and report the results in the self-study.
2. Justification for additional funding is necessary to make this program's request stand out from similar requests in many programs.
3. Develop additional recruitment measures for the Sociology major.
4. Subcommittee recommended unconditional continuation of this program.
