



> Short C.V. - Upload in Blue & Gold - Dept Admin Associate can help upload for all courses

> > Syllabus - Upload in Blue & Gold - Must indicate SLOs target for course. Deadline to upload is 1st class day.

Critical Items to Know All Faculty Members

Texas Senate Bill 17 (SB-17)- Words Matter: Terminology for grants, etc.

Appropriate words: 1st generation college students; TAMUK is an HSI Students primarily originate from lower socioeconomic region of the US (use data and statistics in grant proposals)

> Words to avoid: Underrepresented or Underserved populations, Diversity, Inclusion, or Equity based statements, Race or Gender based selective statements


