HUB SUBCONTRACTING PLAN (HSP) IS A REQUIREMENT

• Once the agency determines that HUB subcontracting opportunities are probable in the Scope of Work, a completed HUB Subcontracting Plan <u>must</u> be returned with your Bid/Proposal.

• If the HSP is not submitted with your response or fails to meet good faith effort requirements, your response <u>will not</u> proceed to the evaluation team.

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HUB Subcontracting Plan (HSP) Quick Checklist



There are 4 OPTIONS available to complete the HSP.
