How can a student request to have an ESA in on-campus housing?

To be considered for a disability-related housing accommodation, Texas A&M University-Kingsville requires:

- The student will need to follow the accommodation process by submitting an application and documentation for review in the AIM portal.
- Submit documentation of the student's current condition from the treating clinical professional or health care provider. This provider must be thoroughly familiar with the student's condition and functional limitations and must make a direct connection to the requested accommodation based on the student's current functional limitations. This provider may not be a relative of the student.
